Accommodation	
Student Dormitory	The International Office offers support in finding accommodation. However, the <u>Studierendenwerk</u> <u>Thüringen (student service</u> ) is in charge for the allocation. It offers approximately 1100 places in single or shared apartments. The university does not have its own accommodation.
